# WHAT'S THE CRIME MR WOLF

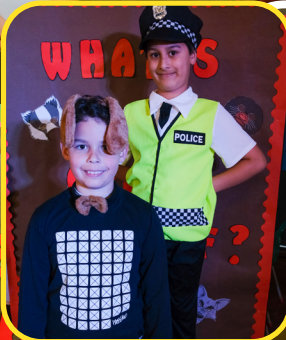
The children in Oak and Redwood Class wowed their families and friends with their superb acting and singing in their recent production: What's the Crime Mr Wolf?

Was Mr Wolf guilty or not-guilty? We are sure, if you saw the show, that you'd agree that the children were guilty of a fantastic performance!

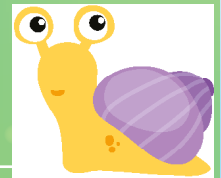
A thank you to Miss Jones, Miss Ward, Tracy H and Paula for helping the children prepare for the show.

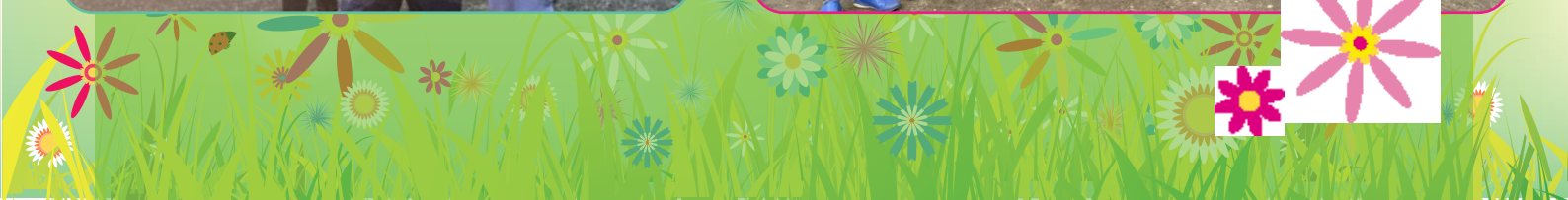


# HILLTOP RESIDENTIAL
